The Great Song Of Indifference – Bob Geldof - Notes



- **Activity type**: Matching positives and negatives, practising structures with 'or', discussing things we should care about, identifying references to these issues in a song.
- **Level:** First part (up to Step 5) Pre-Intermediate (A2), second part Intermediate (B1/B1+)
- Note: From Geldof's second solo album The Vegetarians Of Love, released in 1990, this has been described as "an irreverent stab at apathy".
 In 1984 BBC footage of starving children in Ethiopia prompted Geldof to enlist his musician friends to record a charity single it is estimated that Band Aid and the following year's Live Aid concert helped save the lives of over 6 million Ethiopians.
 - 1) Give each student a copy of the folded worksheet and ask them to complete the two exercises.

2) Students repeat "Yes or no" in chorus. Stress "yes", stress "no". No stress on "or". Do the same with the other six, but speak only the first word:

Teacher: fly

Class: fly or crash.

3) Play the first part of the song, up to "Where I'm going or where I've been / I don't mind at all". Students note which word comes first ("live" or "die"?). Do not give them the lyrics.

Write: I don't mind / I don't care / I don't care less / I couldn't care less on the board. Point out that they all express indifference.

- 4) Discussion: What should be care about in today's world? What should be not be indifferent to? Elicit:
 - other people's welfare, regardless of nationality
 - the economy
 - deforestation
 - global warming
 - the environment

- culture
- religion
- hunger and thirst
- disappearing animal species
- political corruption
- 5) Ask students to unfold the worksheet and look at the lyrics. Play the second part of the song, from "I don't mind if the government falls" students identify references to things we should care about.
- 6) Ask why Bob Geldof keeps repeating "I don't mind" and "I don't care". Does he really mean it? Tell the class about Band Aid and Geldof's other activities. Quote his words to a politician who was theorizing about ways of feeding the hungry in the world: "It's really very simple, Governor. When people are hungry they die. So spare me your politics and tell me what you need and how you're going to get it to these people."
- 7) Sing along with Bob.
