This activity was presented in 2015-2016. "Stage directions" are on the left, the spoken words are on the right.

Show each line of the next slide line by line as you speak.

OK, let's get down to business, let's start. Let's do some activities, let's take it to the next level, let's continue playing music, let's keep the records spinning.

- get up / get down
- let's get down to business
- let's take it to the next level
- let's keep the records spinning

Play the second verse of **Don't Worry** by **Madcon feat. Ray Dalton (2015)**. Use fingers to indicate each line as it is played. Repeat a second time. The correct order is *business - records spinning - next level*. Feedback, then sing full song together with the lyrics projected.

Show the previous slide again, elicit the word Let's. Elicit the word Suggestion. Elicit Let Us (someone will almost certainly say Let Is...)

Show next slide bit by bit, revealing the word Verb last.

There are three sentences beginning with Let's – they all appear in the next song. In what order do you hear them?

So, three sentences beginning with...?

What does Let's mean?

Let's is a contraction of two words, what are they?

Let's get down to business, let's take it to the next level. What kind of words are get and take?

Play extracts from the following songs, with lyrics projected, all featuring let's with verb.

- **Let's Get Loud** by **Jennifer Lopez** (1999)
- **Let's Twist Again** by **Chubby Checker** (1961)
- **We Are The World** by **U.S.A. For Africa** (1985) (*let's start giving*)
- **We Are Young** by **fun.** (2012) (*let's set the world on fire*)
- **Get Lucky** by **Daft Punk** (2013) (*let's raise the bar*)
- **Let's Get It On** by **Marvin Gaye** (1973)

Students rarely knew.

Play and extract from **Marvin Gaye** by **Charlie Puth and Meghan Trainor** (2015), with lyrics projected.

Elicit the word Noun.

Elicit Verb.

Project an enormous X over the lyrics.

You already know this, because a lot of songs use let's – let's listen to some!

Who's this?

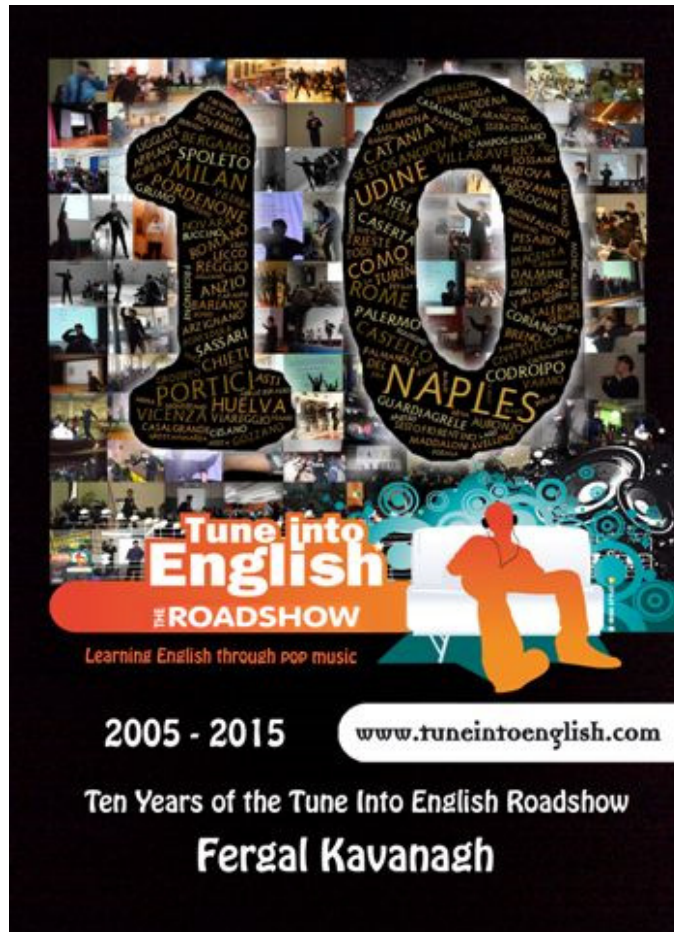
You think you don't know who this is, but you do... This is... Marvin Gaye!
