

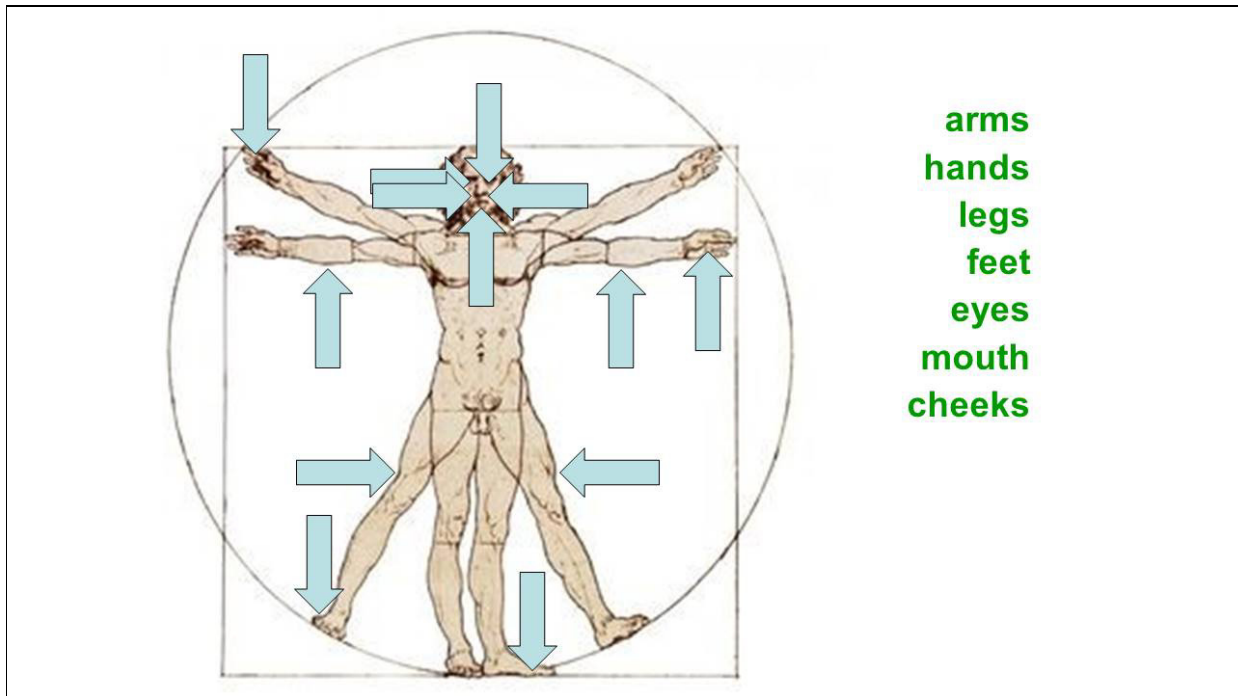
Thinking Out Loud – Ed Sheeran

This activity was presented in 2015-2016. "Stage directions" are on the left, the spoken words are on the right.

Show the slide, a picture of Leonardo Da Vinci's Vitruvian Man. Elicit the answers. Elicit Vinci

What's this?
It's the Vitruvian Man! Who drew it?
Where did Leonardo come from?
Imagine, if Leonardo da Vinci had come from Naples, it would be the Vesuvian Man!?
What's this?

Add arrows to the slide by one to elicit the parts of the body.



Elicit the number Seven.

How many parts of the body can you see?

Play the first verse of **Thinking Out Loud** by **Ed Sheeran** (2014).

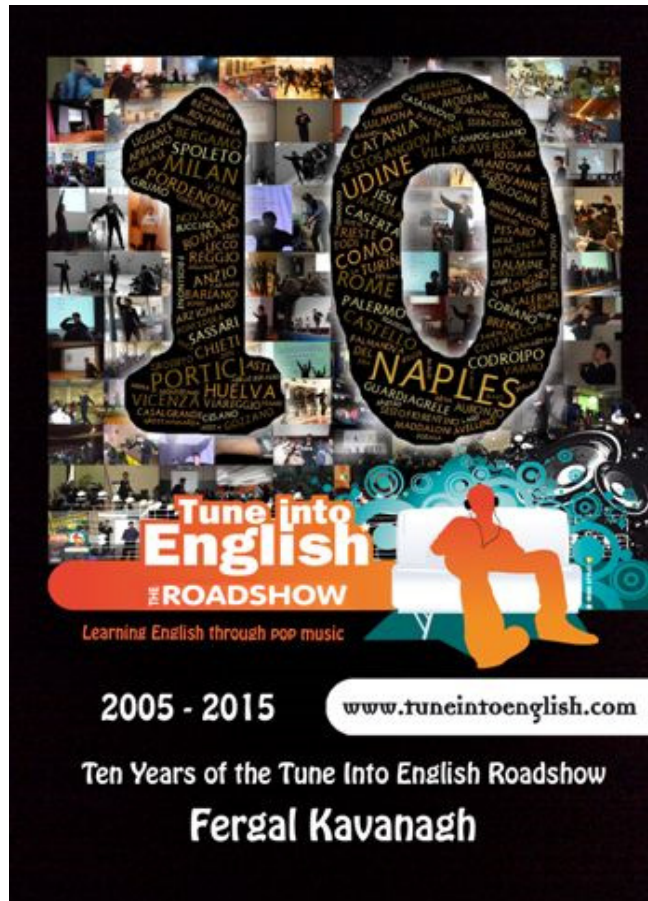
You will hear five of these in the next song. In what order do you hear them?

Use fingers to indicate each word as it is played.

Repeat a second time.

The order is: *legs – feet – mouth – eyes – cheeks.*

Feedback, then sing together with the lyrics projected. Students often sang this with the microphone.



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
