## California Dreamin' – The Mamas & The Papas – Notes

- Activity types: gap fill.
- **Grammar**: Present Simple, Past Simple, Present Perfect, Second Conditional, Future going to.
- Phonetic: /eɪ/
- Time: 20 mins.
- **Note:** Released in 1965, this was written by newly-married singers John and Michelle Phillips in a cold New York winter. The song was inspired by Michelle's homesickness, with the second verse based on their recent visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral.
  - Ask students if they have ever been to California. What is the biggest city? <u>Key:</u> Los Angeles, abbreviated L.A.
  - 2) Give them one minute to write as many words as possible that rhyme with the letter 'A' (/eɪ/). Feedback.
  - 3) Tell them they are going to listen to a song about someone who would like to be in L.A.
     play the song, which words do they hear? Which word is spelled differently?
     <u>Key:</u> See complete lyrics. Point out that 'grey' is spelled 'gray' in American English.
  - 4) Give each student a copy of the worksheet. Ask them to work in pairs to complete the lyrics with the correct form of the verb.
  - Play the song. Students check and correct, then feedback.
     Point out that the singer incorrectly sings 'like' instead of 'likes' in the second verse. The use of the Present Perfect in the first and third verses in also, arguably, incorrect.
  - 6) Sing together!
