Leaving On A Jet Plane – John Denver – Notes



- Activity type: storytelling, gap fill, vocabulary with pictures, listening for specific words.
- Grammar: Present Continuous
- Level: Elementary / Pre-Intermediate.
- **Note:** Written by John Denver, this was a Number One for Peter, Paul and Mary in 1969. Denver subsequently released his own version the same year.
- 1) Students work in groups of 3 or 4. Give each group a folded copy of the worksheet. Ask them to invent a story using the pictures.
- 2) Feedback, then ask them to work on the Present Continuous activity.
- 3) Play the song and ask them to check, as well as to order the pictures and the sentences. (Note, the sentences are all in the first two verses and chorus.)

Pictures:

- 1. my bags are packed
- 2. the taxi's waiting
- 3. leaving on a jet plane
- 4. you'll wear my wedding ring
- 5. close your eyes

Sentences:

- 1. I'm standing here outside your door

- 4) Ask them to unfold the page and to read the lyrics, the complete the True/False activity.
